



To make music in the heart.



PEN DROP PROJECT

What's a Pen Drop?

Imagine being a server in a restaurant, having a bad day. You're stressed by the demands of your customers and have just about reached the end of your patience and your hope. You don't know how to deal with your problems and have nowhere to turn. Then, on one of your tables, you find something clipped to your tip. It's a blue pen with a message: "**God Loves You and So Do We – Unity Baptist Church.**" Think about the impact that simple message might have, and what God might do with that message. That's the Pen Drop Project. We leave these pens with (not instead of) our tips, and let God do the rest.



How's our progress?

We've gone through a thousand pens. It's not certain that all these pens have found their way to restaurant servers and other targets, but we are sure that a lot of them have gone where we wanted them to go. More importantly, we know that a lot of them have gone where God wanted them to go. We also know that God promised us that His word would not return void – that it would always accomplish His purpose.

What next?

It's time to order more pens and for each of us to carefully consider supporting this project. Let's get this message out to everyone we can reach – God loves everyone, and Unity Baptist Church wants to share that love.



Youth Notes

JOHN SMOOT, YOUTH MINISTER



¹² *Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith and in purity. (1 Timothy 4:12)*

2011 is history, we are preparing for another wonderful year of enjoying the blessings that God provides. So many times people will ask "How you doing", many times this is just done out of courtesy and they don't even wait for a response. My favorite response is that "I'm Blessed", which sometimes catches people off guard but some, will respond with, "so am I". I sincerely feel my response as we all should. We are all blessed way beyond what we deserve. Yes, there are struggles in everyone's lives whether it is financial stress, relationship stress or countless other stresses. But, we should remember how many blessings He pours out upon us, with Him all things are possible and He will help us through all the most trying times. And now, He gives us a new year to continue to enjoy those blessings as we grow in Him.

Our youth are not that really much different than us, they are dealing with stresses in life much as we do, they are challenged with the same temptations that we grew up with and are dealing with today. One difference is the magnification and availability of many of these temptations, through technology and the reduced morals of our nation.

We recently discussed the Temptation of Jesus found in Luke 4:1-13. We talk a lot about the temptations our youth struggle with in this world but I am really focusing on getting back to basics lately. I want them to understand that all Christians must face Satan's temptations, just as Jesus did, and we must be prepared to face these temptations. We cannot do it alone; we need to embrace the filling and power of the Holy Spirit within us to defeat the things with which we are challenged. Satan does not play fair; he will attack us at our weakest times and attack us in the same areas that he attacked Jesus, with physical material and prideful temptations. With Him we can face these challenges, without Him we are at a loss.

We have been studying social issues the last few weeks during our Bible Study hour and have looked at the broad issue of being "Difference Makers". We have discussed issues beginning with social ills and why we should care about social issues and the reality that we are here to make a difference, we are responsible for helping others in ways of service and even to the point of helping them understand the reality of God's design for marriage and the issues of racial lines. His word encourages service and makes it clear that we honor God when we provide service to others, Proverbs 14:31, states, ***He who oppresses the poor shows contempt for their Maker, but whoever is kind to the needy honors God.*** Very early in Genesis He identifies His design for marriage and its one woman, one man, Genesis 2:22-24, ²² ***Then the LORD God made a woman from the rib he had taken out of the man, and he brought her to the man.*** ²³ ***The man said, "This is now bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called 'woman,' for she was taken out of man."*** ²⁴ ***That is why a man leaves his father and mother and is united to his wife, and they become one flesh.*** Lastly, He makes it

clear that we are all created from one man and are to love one another, Galatians 5:13-19, ¹³ ***You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love. ¹⁴ For the entire law is fulfilled in keeping this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself."*** ¹⁵ ***if you bite and devour each other watch out or you will be destroyed by each other.*** We are all created in the image of God and should not let our own social discomforts keep us from realizing that.

During December we enjoyed our third Christmas together as we celebrated with our third annual youth Christmas dinner, gift exchanges and lock-in. They must have worked hard in school the Friday of the lock-in because we had many crash much earlier than most lock-in nights. I believe we had fourteen youth at this year's event and I can tell you that none of them stayed awake all night. The only one still awake at 7 Am was yours truly. I must be getting older though because I don't recover from these as fast as I used to.

With your help we have been busy with the nursing home ministry. Thanks to Sherry, Sally and the parents of our young children, we were able to take the Children's Christmas program to the nursing home; you should have seen the faces and smiles from the residents in attendance. Additionally, thanks to your support we were able to provide 18 residents with gifts that they would not have received without your generous donations. The residents we provided gifts for were long term residents and many of them have no family visit or any family that would have provided for them. Thank you for supporting this important ministry.

One way that you can help in fundraising without even giving money is to use the Kroger cards that we have available, if you have one, please continue to use it, usage has fallen off dramatically but we generally receive a \$200 check from Kroger's about every three months and that helps. If you don't have one and want one please talk to me. Also, Debbie Vescio has organized with Meijer the use of a Meijer card, this card is different than the Kroger card as you do not have to load it then use it, you just present it when you pay at Meijer's and the youth will receive a small percentage. Please utilize each of these to help support your youth.

Ski Trip – MLK Weekend – Jan 13 – 16, 2012 – Winterplace West Virginia

We are going to begin having weekly or bi-weekly game/movie nights very soon. Kim and I want to find additional ways to have our youth fellowship with one another as well as to invite other non-churched youth. These types of gatherings may be an opportunity to reach out to some of the youth we are not making contact with.

God is doing great things in each of our youth's lives. I ask that you continue to pray for their continued growth in the Lord. These young people are growing up in a very challenging time and they are our future.


